ASK MASK[?]

Q: I have been talking online with this girl for the last few months. She tells me she loves me and she can't wait to meet in real life. Should I meet her?

— Damien, 8th grade, Cave Creek, Arizona

A: Damien, it seems that you really like this girl, but how do you know that she is who she says she is? I would recommend that you **DO NOT** meet this girl face-to-face for your safety—she could be a predator. You never know who people are online. But if you decide to go even though it is not safe, do not go alone. Tell your trusted adult where you're going, have an exit strategy, and meet her in a public place.

Q: One of my friends posted inappropriate pictures of herself on social media. While many people posted nice comments, she has some cyberbullies. She called me crying yesterday because someone photoshopped her face onto a naked body and linked it onto a website. What should she do?

— Samantha, 7th grade, Peoria, Arizona

A: This is serious. The first thing she needs to do is tell a trusted adult and call the police and ask for Internet Crimes Against Children. Then report it as spam through whatever social media site the photo was posted to. Whoever did that can be charged

with cyberstalking. And, since it is on her social media, your friend could be charged with distributing child pornography if she doesn't report it.

Q: My best friend got a picture from this guy that she really likes. He sent her a naked photo of himself and she has been showing it to people in the halls. Is that ok?

— Amanda, 7th grade, Tulsa, Oklahoma

A: As her good friend, you should tell her that what she is doing is illegal. Remember, she can be convicted of distributing child pornography and kids go to jail for stuff like this. Tell her to delete the photo and tell him not to do that ever again.

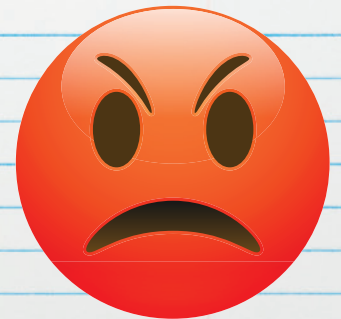

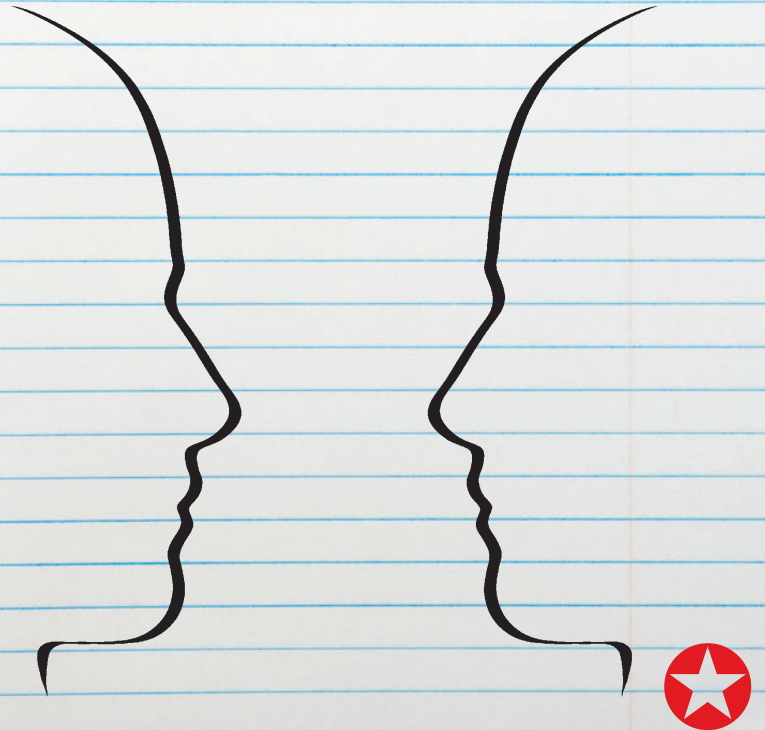

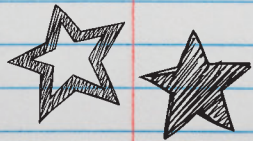
